BUTTERNUT SQUASH, SPINACH & FETA PIE

Ingredients:

12 phyllo dough sheets 100g melted salted butter 1 tbsp sesame seeds

For the filling:

1 large butternut squash, peeled & diced

150g finely chopped spinach 200g cubed feta cheese Fresh rosemary 30g chopped fresh dill 60ml olive oil Salt and black pepper to taste

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 220°C. Arrange the squash on a large baking tray, drizzle with olive oil, and sprinkle with rosemary, salt, and pepper. Toss to coat and roast for about 30 minutes, or until the squash becomes tender. Allow it to cool.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix the roasted squash, spinach, feta, dill, and a bit more salt and pepper. Add the olive oil and stir everything together.
- 3. Grease a 28-30 cm round baking tin lightly with melted butter.
- 4. Lay one phyllo sheet on your work surface, brush it with melted butter, and layer a second sheet on top, brushing again with butter. Continue this process with a third sheet.
- 5. Spoon 1/3 of the filling along one long edge of the phyllo stack and roll it up. Coil the roll into a spiral and place it in the center of your prepared tin. Repeat the process with the remaining phyllo sheets and filling, coiling each roll around the center.
- 6. Brush the top of the pie with more melted butter, sprinkle with sesame seeds, and bake for 50-60 minutes until the pastry turns golden brown and fully cooked through.
